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
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1 Introduction

This player software is a video player used to play recording files saved on your computer. It supports video formats including .ts and .mp4, 1/4/9/16 window layouts, and provides synchronous play, watermark detection, snapshot, video clipping and fisheye control functions.

2 GUI Introduction

The player's main GUI.



No.	Description
1	Add file(s) to the list or clear the list.
2	Top toolbar: Watermark Detection, System Configuration, Change Language, View Help.
3	Files list and Channels list. You may use keyword to filter files and set play mode.
4	Open Folder, Digital Zoom, Snapshot, Clip Recording, Fisheye Control.
5	Video playing area (can set windows).
6	Playing toolbar.

3 System Configuration

Click **Config** in the top toolbar to view or change the formats and locations of snapshots and video clips saved to your computer.

4 Video Operations

Add, play and delete videos. Play multiple videos synchronously.

Add Videos

Select video files on your computer and then add to the file list.



click above the **Files** list and then select a method:

- Add File: Add specified file(s) (use mouse with Ctrl or Shift to select multiple).
- Add Folder: Specify a folder to add all video files in it (including sub folders). Choose a mode:
 - Add: Add new files without affecting the existing files on the list.
 - Overwrite: Clear the list and then add new files.

The added files appear on the list. To delete a file or clear the list:

- Delete a file: click right to the file.
- Clear the list: click on the top.



These operations do not delete video file(s) from your computer.

Play Video

Double-click a file under the **Files** list or drag the file to a window. You may also drag a file directly from a local folder to a window.



- Click right to the search box to set a play mode: play one file, play all files, repeat one file, and repeat all files.
- Double-click a window to maximize/restore.
- Drag a window to switch position with another window.

Playing Toolbar

Playing toolbar under the Files list.

B/C/D/E	Set window layout: 1/4/9/16 windows.
F	Stop all videos.
G/K	Slow/fast forward.
Н	Pause video in the selected window.

L	Synchronous play (ineffective under the Files list; effective under the Channels list).
М	Turn on/off audio. Audio can be turned on for one window only.
N	Adjust sound volume.


Channels List

Click the **Channels** list to view and play video files by channel.

1. Dates with recordings are highlighted on the calendar (e.g., 22 and 25).




2. Click a date with recordings. The **Channels** list shows channels that have recordings on this day.




3. Click a channel. The **Files** list on the right shows the start and end times of recordings of this channel (see figure below). To play a file,

double-click it. To delete a file from the list, click (the file will not be deleted from your computer).



- on the playing toolbar; or click right after you select channels to play recordings of the selected channels in synchronous manner.
- 5. The toolbar operation is similar to the playing toolbar on the **Files** list.
- **6.** Below the toolbar is the time line.



5 Watermark Detection

Verify video watermark to ensure video is intact.

- 1. Click Watermark in the top toolbar.
- 2. Click , select video files, and then click **Open**.

3. Click to select video file(s); or click to select all.

4. Click Start Detect.

Detection result and status appear in the **Status** column when detection is completed. The following table describes the status and result.

Status and Result	Description
Succeeded: video intact	Watermark secure
Succeeded: video altered	Watermark altered
Succeeded: no watermark	No watermark detected
Failed: no video or video is too short	Detection failed

6 Other Operations

View Software Version

Click **Help** > **About** in the top toolbar to view current software version.

Open Folder

Click a window in which video is playing and then click **Open Folder** to open the folder where the video is located.

Digital Zoom

Enable digital zoom to zoom in on video images.

- 1. Click the window.
- 2. Click in the top toolbar. changes to , meaning the function is enabled.
- **3.** Use the scroll wheel on your mouse to zoom in on the image. Drag to move the image as needed.

Snapshot

Take a snapshot of video images playing in a window and save the snapshot to your computer. The format and location of the snapshot is set under **Config** in the top toolbar. Change settings if necessary.

- **1.** Click the window.
- 2. Click in the top toolbar. The snapshot is saved automatically.

Clip Recording

Clip a video playing in a window and save the video clip on your computer. The format and location of the video clip is set under **Config** in the top toolbar. Change the settings if necessary.

- 1. Click the window.
- 2. Click in the top toolbar. A message appears to indicate recording has started.
- 3. Click to stop. The video clip is saved automatically.

Fisheye Control

Set mount mode and display mode of fisheye video to get desired images.

- 1. Play the fisheye video.
- 2. Click in the top toolbar and select mount and display mode as needed on the control panel.
- Mount Mode: Ceiling, Wall, Desktop.
- Display Mode: Original Image, 360° Panoramic+1PTZ, 180°
 Panoramic, Fisheye+3PTZ, Fisheye+4PTZ, 360° Panoramic+6PTZ,
 Fisheye+8PTZ, Panoramic, Panoramic+3PTZ, Panoramic+4PTZ,
 Panoramic+8PTZ (clicking Original Image switches from dewarping

mode to normal mode).



NOTE!

- The fisheye control button is available only for fisheye videos.
- In dewarping mode, you may click a PTZ window and then use the
 mouse to drag the image, or zoom in/out using the scroll wheel; or click
 a panoramic window and then drag, zoom in or out on the demarcation
 area.
- Digital zoom is disabled in dewarping mode, and the digital zoom button is hidden. If you switch to dewarping mode when digital zoom is enabled, digital zoom will be disabled automatically, and the image restores its original size.
